




In 1903, W.E.B DuBois becomes SEF's First Fellow









Strategies - What Do We Do?

- Leadership Development











SEF's Latest Engagements In Georgia

SEF Opposition to School Privatization Efforts

- School Vouchers States offer parents a certain amount of public education funding for private school tuition.
- Education Savings Account States set aside funding and place it in individual accounts for students to be used for a variety of services.
- **Tax-Credit Scholarship** States offer businesses or individuals tax credits to donate money to nonprofit student scholarship-granting organizations.

Georgia Education Scholarship Act HB301 / SB173 - 2019

• Established an Education Savings Account for students with disabilities

Main Issues

- Unproven strategy to improve outcomes for SWD or traditional students
- Disinvests in public schools
- Duplicative school voucher program and current IDEA protections
- Fails to pay for avg. costs of attendance (\$8k vs real costs of \$18k)

SEF's Legislative Priorities

- 1. <u>Update and revamp</u> QBE and <u>adopt</u> an "Opportunity weight" for low-income students
- 2. <u>Advance Community Schools</u> by streamlining wraparound services
- 3. <u>Eliminate or sunset</u> all school privatization efforts
