
Roughly **33%** of African American children live in poverty in Georgia as opposed to **11%** of white children.

Percent of students scoring "Proficient" or "Distinguished" Learners, by grade-level





Percent of students scoring "Proficient" or "Distinguished" Learners, by grade-level






Percent of students scorings "Proficient" or "Distinguished" Learners, by grade-level and Race/Ethnicity





### Georgia ACT Test Scores



#### **1. Increase Funding for Historically Disadvantaged Populations**

- Update the Quality Basic Education funding formula to what it costs to educate lowincome students
- Provide additional funding to districts for educating low-income students, such as an "Opportunity Weight" suggested by GBPI
- Defund all school vouchers and tax-credit scholarship programs

2. Streamline Wraparound Services to Meet Academic and Non-Academic Needs – Community Schools (Services are to be determined at the community level)
